Study reveals evolutionary arms race: Ebola vs. bats

CU 12/22) - The Ebola virus and fruit bats have been waging a molecular battle for survival that may have started at least 25 million years ago, according to a study led by researchers at the University of Colorado Boulder, Albert Einstein College of Medicine and the U.S. Army Medical Research Institute of Infectious Diseases (USAMRIID).

The findings, published December 22 in the journal **ELIFE**, shed new light on the biological factors that determine which bat species may harbor the virus in between outbreaks in humans and how bats may transmit the virus to people.

The researchers showed that a single amino acid change in the Ebola virus could overcome the resistance of the African straw-colored fruit bat cells to infection. These findings hint at one way in which Ebola and other highly infectious filoviruses can evolve to better infect a host.

"There seems to be a low barrier for Ebola virus to establish itself in this type of bat," said co-lead author Sara Sawyer, an associate professor in CU-Boulder's Molecular, Cellular, and Developmental Biology and the BioFrontiers Institute. "One has to wonder why that has not happened yet."

To learn more, the researchers exposed cells from four types of African bats (two of them previously linked to Ebola) to several filoviruses, including Ebola. Cells from only one type of bat proved resistant to Ebola virus infection: the African straw-colored fruit bat, which

is commonly hunted for bushmeat in West Africa and migrates long distances.

Outbreaks of Ebola virus disease among humans are thought to begin when a person comes into contact with a wild animal carrying Ebola virus.

"We knew from our previous research that Ebola virus infects host cells by attaching its surface glycoprotein to a host cell receptor called NPC1," said Kartik Chandran, an associate professor of microbiology and immunology at Albert Einstein College of Medicine in New York and a co-lead author of the study. "Here, we show how bats have evolved to resist Ebola infection and how, in turn, the virus could have evolved to overcome that resistance."

"Identifying potential animal reservoir hosts for Ebola virus will provide a crucial guide for public health prevention and response programs going forward," said Maryska Kaczmarek, a graduate researcher in Sawyer's lab and a co-author of the study.

There are currently no FDA-approved treatments or vac-

cines for the Ebola virus. The 2014 Ebola outbreak in West Africa was the world's deadliest to date, infecting an estimated 28,000 people and killing more than 11,000, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

The study was co-authored by Melinda Ng, Esther Ndungo, Rohit Jangra and Rohan Biswas, all at Albert Einstein; John Hawkins and Ann Demogines, all at University of Texas at Austin; Andrew Herbert, Ana Kuehne and Rebekah James, all at USAMRIID in Maryland; Tabea Binger and Marcel Müller at University of Bonn Medical Center; Robert Gifford at University of Glasgow; Meng Yu and Lin-Fa Wang at Duke-NUS Graduate Medical School; Thijn Brummelkamp at Netherlands Cancer Institute; Christian Drosten at the German Centre for Infectious Diseases Research; and Jens Kuhn at the National Institutes of Health's Integrated Research Facility at Fort Detrick.

Colo. still the least obese state; top in physical activity

COHealthDept 12/10 — Colorado is the eighth healthiest state according to United Health Foundation's annual health rankings, released December 10. The index ranks Colorado as the least obese state, No. 1 in physical activity and second lowest in diabetes prevalence.

Colorado ranked second lowest in cardiovascular deaths and third lowest in cancer deaths. Both rankings were unchanged from 2014.

Dr. Larry Wolk, executive director and chief medical officer at the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, said, "The health of individuals depends on many entities working together to promote and support healthy living...."

Recent examples of Colorado's public health-based efforts to ensure conditions in which entire populations can be healthy include:

—Facilitating timely and complete immunizations for children and other populations at risk for infectious diseases.

—Reducing deaths from motor vehicle accidents across populations, especially younger drivers, through education about driving safety, seatbelt use and distracted driving.

—Developing policies such as limits on cigarette advertising and bans on smoking in public areas to decrease smoking and help reduce smoking-related heart disease, hypertension and respiratory disease.

—Reducing prescription drug abuse and overdose by

supporting prescription drug monitoring programs that require pharmacy participation and physician registration.

—Reducing teen pregnancy through efforts to make long-acting reversible contraception available to teens, which reduces maternal and infant morbidity and mortality and the likelihood of subsequent unintended pregnancies among teens and young adults. This work provides teens opportunities to escape poverty, complete an education and join the workforce.

Each year, United Health Foundation analyzes behaviors, public and health policies, community and environmental conditions, and clinical care data to provide its annual health rankings. •

DEAR EARTHTALK: What do green groups think about the outcome of the recent Paris climate talks?

On December 12, 2015, 195 countries assembled at the COP21 Climate Conference in Paris produced a 32-page agreement outlining goals to phase out industrial carbon dioxide (CO₂) emissions. All countries agreed on “holding the increase in the global average temperature to well below 2 degrees Celsius above pre-industrial levels and pursuing efforts to limit the temperature increase to 1.5 degrees Celsius.”

Each country submitted a voluntary pledge for cutting its CO₂ emissions, known as an “intended nationally determined contribution,” or INDC. These pledges are not strong enough to achieve the two-degree target, but countries involved are required to monitor and report their emissions data, which will be reviewed every five years, and are expected to update their emissions reductions over time.

“While the Paris commitments won’t deliver all the emissions reductions that are needed, the agreement provides a framework to ratchet up ambition over time: a transparent system for reporting and review, regular assessments of progress, and strengthening of commitments every five years beginning in 2020,” said Fred Krupp, President of the Environmental Defense Fund (EDF). “The agreement relies on each nation to enact its own policies to reduce emissions while ensuring that their progress can be monitored by all. We look forward to each country’s work to both meet and build on their pledges in order to finish the hard work of protecting future generations.”

But distant promises standing in for present-day pledges adequate enough to achieve the agreement’s temperature goals have left many green groups disappointed. In a statement issued shortly after the release of the final agreement,

Bill McKibben, the co-founder of 350.org, said: “Every government seems now to recognize the fossil fuel era must end, and soon. But the power of the fossil fuel industry is reflected in the text, which drags out the transition so far that endless climate damage will be done. Since pace is the crucial question now, activists must redouble our efforts to weaken that industry.”

Kumi Naidoo, executive director of Greenpeace International, reflected post-Paris that a continued, unrelenting push for clean, renewable fuels by green groups is crucial. “When it comes to forcing real, meaningful action, Paris fails to meet the moment,” Naidoo said. “We have a 1.5-degree wall to climb, but the ladder isn’t long enough... To pull us free of fossil fuels we are going to need to mobilize in ever greater numbers... We will push our beautifully simple solution to climate change—100 percent renewable energy for all—and make sure it is heard and embraced.”

In addition to green group backlash, the Paris agreement was openly condemned in recent press and by former NASA scientist James Hansen, who called it “fraud,” yet some remain optimistic that the conversion to sustainable energy is inevitable. Michael Burger, executive director of the Sabin Center for Climate Change Law at Columbia Law School, told ThinkProgress: “The leaders of the world recognize that the consequences of noncompliance are disastrous. We are looking at the wholesale transformation of our global climate. The main incentive here for compliance is not the threat of some civil penalty—noncompliance would mean environmental disaster.”

A 21st-century open-records law for Colorado

When was the last time you used microfilm or microfiche to find information? Does the phrase “on-line bulletin board” bring to mind that screeching noise associated with dial-up connections from 20 years ago?

That’s how long it’s been since the Colorado Open Records Act (CORA) was amended to ensure access to public records “kept only in miniaturized or digital form.” This section of the law, with its tech terms from the 1990s and earlier, is so antiquated and so nonspecific that it’s practically useless.

Vital information about our state and local governments is stored in databases and spreadsheets: salaries, budgets, building permits, revenue, spending ... the list goes on. But requesting databases and spreadsheets is a crapshoot in Colorado.

If you’re lucky, you’ll have no problem getting public records in a format that allows for searching, sorting and aggregating. Too often, however, database records are released in a format that makes analysis difficult, or they’re not released at all.

Remember: Public money pays for the creation and maintenance of databases used by state agencies, cities, counties, school districts and special districts. These databases contain information about how your tax dollars are spent and how government policies are formulated and implemented.

It shouldn’t be hard for journalists and interested citizens to get and explore public information.

But consider Colorado State University’s response when the Fort Collins Coloradoan wanted to scrutinize salary trends for CSU employees. The information is kept in a database, but CSU officials pointed the newspaper to 145 printed pages on file at the university’s library.

How did the Westminster school district respond when the former president of the school board requested the salaries of district employees? This being a decade and a half into the 21st century, she expected the information in a spreadsheet. Instead, after four denials, she was billed \$745.50 for 2,982 hand-redacted pieces of paper.

As the Westminster district initially claimed, governments will say they are not required to manipulate existing records in response to a request. If the data set you want contains something confidential, like Social Security numbers, you might be denied access to all of the information.

Instead of excluding the confidential field and releasing the remainder, the government chooses to release no records at all.

Another common and frustrating scenario: You’re given database records as a PDF, which may or may not be machine readable. To conduct any kind of analysis, you’ll need to input the information by hand or risk using a file-conversion program that might not work so well. In essence, governments are forcing citizens to recreate public records that already exist and were generated through the expenditure of taxpayer funds.

Fortunately, two state lawmakers want to eliminate these access problems. Sen. John Kefalas, D-Fort Collins, and Rep. Dan Pabon, D-Denver, plan a 2016 bill that would guarantee the right to obtain public records in a “digitized database format,” if that’s how a government maintains the records. Any confidential fields of information would be removed.

Although other states have similar laws, local governments have expressed concerns about ensuring the “integrity” of their databases and the cost of providing records in this way. But isn’t it less time consuming—and less expensive—to remove a column from a spreadsheet than it is to redact 2,982 sheets of paper by hand?

And how is the integrity of government data threatened by the public release of a copy? A real data integrity issue is that information might be lost or garbled when tables from a multi-page PDF must be brought into Microsoft Excel.

By far the best solution is for governments to proactively post databases online in downloadable, machine-readable formats. This helps governments be open and accountable, and saves the cost of responding to repeated CORA requests for the same records.

Many governments in Colorado do this now, to varying degrees, but an open-data law or policy would encourage this practice and provide guidance as to which databases should and should not be put on the web, and in what format(s).

That would be 21st-century transparency.
